**Kansas City, Mo, - February 2, 2011** – The Children's Mercy South and Children's Mercy Northland Urgent Care Centers will both reopen today, Wednesday, February 2, 2011. Both Centers were closed yesterday due to the inclement weather conditions in the Kansas City metropolitan area.
