

Tracheostomy Care - Changing the Ties and stoma and neck care

Change the tracheostomy ties daily or more often if they become wet or dirty.

Clean the skin around the stoma and change the tracheostomy ties as follows:

- 1. Wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds
- 2. Gather supplies and place them where they can be easily reached.

Supplies Needed:

- -Current size and smaller size tracheostomy tubes, in case of emergency
- Blanket roll to place under shoulders, if needed
- Swaddle blanket, if needed
- Clean tracheostomy tube ties, cut to size
- Scent free and dye free soap
- Distilled water
- 3: 4x4 gauze(1-soapy/wet, 1-wet, 1-dry)
- 3: Cotton swabs(1-soapy/wet, 1-wet, 1-dry)
- 2x2 split-gauze dressing or other dressing to place in between tracheostomy tube and skin
- 3. Remove your child's clothing from around his/her neck and shoulders
- 4. Position your child on his/her back with a blanket roll under their shoulders (if needed) and swaddle if needed
- 5. Remove and discard the tracheostomy tube dressing
- 6. One caregiver holds tracheostomy tube in place, second caregiver removes tracheostomy ties
- 7. Second caregiver: Using the C-method: Wash, rinse and dry stoma with cotton swabs(Check the skin the stoma for redness, cracks in skin or bleeding)
- 8. Attach a clean tie to each side of the tracheostomy tube
- 9. Place tracheostomy dressing under tracheostomy tube flange
- 10. Second caregiver: wash, rinse and dry neck with 4x4 gauze: check the neck for redness, cracks in skin or bleeding
- 11. Attach a clean tie to each side of the tracheostomy tube
- 12. Place tracheostomy dressing under tracheostomy tube flange
- 13. Fasten the ties securely(The ties should be tight enough that the tip of your little finger can fit between the tie and your child's neck)

Safety Precautions:

- •Stop tracheostomy care cleaning if your child has respiratory distress or becomes overly agitated
- *Have current and size smaller tracheostomy tube easy to access in case of emergency
