TARGET AUDIENCE

This full-day conference is intended for those clinicians who participate in the care of neonates.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

- Discuss important neonatal issues in which neonatal health care providers can advocate.
- Define age of viability and discuss current guidelines.
- Discuss when it is safe to start refeeding after necrotizing enterocolitis.
- List at least two benefits of using nasal cannula and continuous positive airway pressure among the neonatal population.
- Discuss the top 10 lactation issues in the neonatal intensive care unit.
- Discuss teaching strategies in educating parents on safe sleep in neonatal intensive care units.
- List key monitoring issues related to the brain when providing neuroprotective hypothermia in neonates.
- Review the role of antimicrobial stewardship in optimizing antibiotic prescribing.
- Recognize key clinical factors for decision-making for optimal care and outcomes.
