KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Holly Austin Gibbs, BA

Holly has a BA in biology and is Director of the Human Trafficking Response Program at Dignity Health, one of the largest health systems in the nation and the largest hospital provider in California. In her role Holly oversees efforts to recognize and respond to trafficked persons in the health care setting.

Holly is the author of a powerful book, *Walking Prey: How America's Youth are Vulnerable to Sex Slavery* and frequently blogs for the *Huffington Post*.

As a survivor of child sex trafficking, Holly's story has been featured on numerous journalism sites including *Dr. Oz*, *Dallas Morning News*, *Cosmopolitan* magazine, by the *Associated Press* and many other media sources.

Holly has testified before Congress and consulted for numerous organizations, including the U.S. Office for Victims of Crime, National Center for Missing & Exploited Children, National Criminal Justice Training Center and the AMBER Alert program.
