Medical Care for Transgender & Gender Diverse Youth





Guiding Principles

- Gender-affirming model of care
 - Not searching for "what made them trans"
 - Not seeking out reasons to withhold treatment
- Care is outlined by guidelines published by WPATH & Endo Society









Path to Care

Psychologial Diagnosis

- Independent Licensed Mental Health Practitioner
- Assessment of "readiness"

Referral to Gender Affirming Care

 Multidisciplinary vs Endo-only

First consultation

- Initial laboratry evaluation
- Counselling on the permanent, reversible, irreversible effects of care

Parental Support

- Required to initiate treatment for those < 18 years
 - Split households?
 - Different perspectives?
- Parental Fears/Worries
 - Making the final decision on yes/no for tx
 - Tears are not uncommon
 - Struggling with names/pronouns is commonplace
- What about those kids that come without parental support?



Types of Medical/Surgical Tx

Stop unwanted hormones

- GnRH agonists ("blockers")
- Spironolactone
- Menstrual Suppression

Start gender-affirming hormones

- Estradiol (estrogen)
- Testosterone
- Surgical Interventions
 - Feminization: Vaginoplasty, Breast Augmentation, FFS
 - Masculinization: Mastectomy ("top surgery"), Metoidioplasty





Timing of Treatments

- Psychological Interventions
 - Always!!!
- Reversible Therapies
 - Puberty Blocking Medications ("Blockers")
 - Never started before first signs of puberty
- Irreversible Therapies
 - Gender-affirming hormones
 - Not before 16 years old
 - Surgical Interventions
 - Not before 18 years old

Mental Health

- Moderate to Severe Depression
 - 56.7%
- Moderate to Severe Anxiety
 - 50%
- Self-Harm/Suicidal Ideations
 - 43.3%
- After 12 month of PB or GAH Intervention
 - 60% lower odds of depression (OR 0.4)
 - 73% lower odd of suicidality (OR 0.27)

Legislative Policy Effecting the LGBTQ+ Population





Federal

• As of May 2021, Health and Human Services' (HHS) Office for Civil Rights (OCR) would include gender identity and sexual orientation in its interpretation and enforcement of Section 1557's prohibition against sex discrimination

• H.R. 5 prevents discrimination and expands protections





State

Anti-LGBTQ state bills on the rise

Bills specifically targeting transgender Americans have skyrocketed since 2018, with all but three states weighing at least one since 2020.

Prospective legislation would

• Restrict LGBTQ issues in school curriculums

• Limit trans people's ability to play sports, use bathrooms that correspond with their gender identity and receive gender-affirming health care

 Permit religious exemptions to discriminate against the LGBTQ population



Gender Affirming Care & "Don't Say Gay" Legislation

 Alabama, Arkansas, Texas, and Arizona recently passed or enacted legislation restricting youth access to gender affirming care and, in some cases, imposing penalties on adults facilitating access. Alabama, Arkansas, and Texas have been temporarily blocked from enforcing these laws and policies by court order

 "Parental Rights in Education"/"Don't Say Gay" legislation passed in Florida

Key Ideas

- Engage those most impacted
- Assess the physical and cultural environment
 - Evaluate assumptions
- Test, evaluate, evolve
- Sustainability requires data





Engaging Those Most Impacted

- Surveys/big data
- Focus groups
- Key organizations representing the LGBTQ+ voice
 - <u>GLSEN</u>
 - PFLAG
 - HRC-Welcoming Schools





Assessing the Physical & Cultural Environment

- Restrooms
- Preferred name and pronoun usage
- References to "parents/family"
- Proactive training







Get to know the person you are checking in...

- Always look at labels
 - Sex- MTF- Male to Female
 - Sex- FTM- Female to Male
 - ALWAYS use the name in the parenthesis
 - Preferred names and pronouns can change, always ask
- If during check in or the visit you learn the preferred name, or pronouns change, or that a patient identifies as anything other than their birth name or gender, communicate with all staff involved in the patient's care. DO NOT simply put it in your note, add it to the patient's chart.
- Everyone shares the responsibility


