meds decreased his office includes: 1) the In-Check Dial® to assess and coach inhalation technique, and 2) a digital flow meter to measure peak flow as well as a more sensitive measure of airflow – the forced expiratory volume in the first second (FEV1). Assessment of FEV1 can aid you in earlier detection of air flow obstruction that occurs with worsening asthma. There is no cost for you or
